2024 proved to be an exciting year of growth thanks to many volunteer hours and growing community partnerships.

Assist ME realized a 37% increase in patients served in 2024 through almost 10,000 volunteer hours and a record number of mobility devices gifted to our community in need. This couldn't happen without the incredible referral partners from the community - the social workers, case managers, PT/OTs and other medical staff who work tirelessly to help their patients obtain necessary mobility equipment they need to heal or manage independently.

We celebrated our 10 year anniversary in October 2024 with a volunteer appreciation dinner and award presentation to Founder & Executive Director Jack Sheehan and his wife Anita for their outstanding passion and service. It was a fitting tribute to the milestone occasion and dedication of so many volunteers who continue to share the passion of Assist ME's mission.

With the addition of a new Community Outreach & Development Chair to the board in Q4 2024, Assist ME launched a successful peer-to-peer Giving Tuesday Campaign to cap out the year on a positive financial note - one that would help result in a 120% increase in financial donations by year end to include grants, business and individual giving, and 100% Board Member contributions.

Assist ME is excited to build on the momentum of 2024! With new technology implementations to manage our growing inventory, new fundraising and donor stewardship goals, our first signature fundraising event on the horizon, and new partnerships in the works to expand our capacity to give, it's an exciting start to a new year and new decade of giving back to the community.

We hope you will join us as a volunteer, a contributor, sponsor, event committee member or new advisory board member to help us meet and exceed our 2025 goals - and beyond.

OUR STORY SO FAR

ENHANCING LIVES THROUGH MOBILITY

Imagine a world where everyone, regardless of circumstance, can access the essential medical mobility equipment needed to regain independence and thrive. This is the driving force behind Assist ME, a Charlotte-based initiative established in 2014 to bridge the gap for underinsured patients who face barriers to obtaining these vital resources.

At Assist ME, our team is fueled by the unwavering belief that everyone deserves the chance to live with dignity and independence. Join us in changing lives, one piece of equipment at a time.

Since our inception, we've helped over 4,600 individuals not only regain physical mobility but also rebuild their lives. Beyond the immediate benefit of getting back on their feet, our work empowers patients to return to their communities and reclaim independence. This translates to reduced reliance on the healthcare system, saving substantial costs associated with ongoing care for those who cannot efficiently regain lost mobility.

THE PROBLEM DID YOU KNOW?




- 11.3% Mecklenburg County adults are uninsured per 2024 data compared to 13.5% of North Carolinians. That's more than 136,000 people impacted in our community. The percentage of adults without a primary care doctor was 22.3 percent or roughly 269,000 individuals including children - a factor that drives individuals to ER and hospitals for care.
- 2024 poverty rates for Mecklenburg County are as follows: Black (34.30%), Hispanic or Latino (21.20%), White (20.60%), Asian (4.20%), Other Race (13.20%) and two or more races (6.5%).
- Other poverty data includes Age 65 and Older (10.9%) of the overall county population.
- Medicaid doesn't cover health care costs for adults who may earn income above Medicaid
 coverage limits, yet below the poverty level. It can several weeks to several months for
 Medicaid to approve coverage of doctor-prescribed mobility equipment. Waiting for
 approval delays recovery, increases risk of falls and new injuries, and may require patients
 to remain in the hospital longer.
- Medicaid provides wheelchairs and other mobility devices with the expectation it will last five years. If it wears out or is lost or stolen, the recipient is on their own until the 5 year wait period expires.




2024 in-kind donations saved Assist ME \$578K - the cost of equivalent new mobility equipment!



USE OF FUNDS



Assist ME's model of recycling, reusing and regifting gently used mobility equipment has allowed the currently all-volunteer organization to work with very low overhead. However, recent exponential growth means a change in the model for 2025 and beyond. Our goal is to secure more financial donations to add paid staff, CRM inventory database and donor management systems, provide extensive outreach to identify those in need, and to gain new partnerships to better serve our community on a long term, sustainable basis.
